CONTEST - Student Poster & Lightning Talk

TERENA's annual Networking Conferences (TNC) bring together people interested in fostering research and development, as well as implementing and deploying innovative solutions to meet networking challenges for research and education.

The TNC2014 poster & lightning-talk contest gives students in emerging research areas the chance to gain exposure for their ideas and to gather feedback to further inform their efforts.

10 posters will be selected for presentation at TNC2014; the best of these will then be chosen for presentation as a lightning talk.

Applications should include:

- title of the poster (& lightning talk);
- name, school, and contact information of the submitting author;
- names, affiliations, and contact information of any additional authors;
- name of the presenter (if different from the submitting author);
- an extended abstract (max. 2 pages) describing the content of the poster.

A draft poster and talk may also be submitted to support the abstract. Judges may provide feedback on chosen materials.

Submissions will be evaluated on their relevance, importance and quality by a contest committee. Notification of acceptance will be provided to the corresponding author no later than 22 April 2014. A limited number of submissions will be accepted for presentation at TNC2014.

One author from each selected submission will attend TNC2014 free of charge and will potentially receive financial support for travel. The sponsors will award an additional prize to the author whose poster and talk are voted the best by TNC2014 attendees.

The camera-ready version of the poster will be published online as part of the proceedings of TNC2014.

Posters:

These present work achieved using graphs and images more than text, and take a less formal approach than a regular session presentation.

Lightning talks:

These 5-minute talks focus on one key point, allowing you to present a project's updates, get community feedback on an idea, share a quick tip or invite the community to collaborate.

Submitted student posters (& lightning talks) may be about any topic relevant to TNC2014's themes:
