

## THE ESTORIL GLOBAL ISSUES DISTINGUISHED BOOK PRIZE

### RULES FOR ELIGIBILITY

*(Applicable for books published in 2013 and 2014)*

1. The Estoril Conferences awards every two years **The Estoril Global Issues Distinguished Book Prize** for the best book on Globalisation.
2. Eligible books must deal with significant global issues. Priority will be given to books that seek to provide both new analysis as well as new policy perspectives on global issues.
3. The prize consists of 15.000 Euro (fifteen thousand Euro).
4. The prize is awarded by a jury of distinguished international scholars appointed by the Organisation.
5. Books can be co-authored by a maximum of two authors, but no collective edited volumes will be admitted.
6. All books applying must have been published between January 2013 and December 2014.
7. **Deadline for submission is 31 October 2014.** Six copies of each title must be delivered to - **Estoril Conferences – Praça 5 de Outubro, 2754-501 Cascais – Portugal** plus a PDF copy in order to simplify the delivery to the Jury. When the books are not published in English, an equal number of printed and bounded copies of an English translation must also be provided.
8. Books published until December 2014 may be submitted in galley form.
9. A shortlist of up to five nominee titles will be announced in the 1<sup>st</sup> of January 2015.
10. The winning book will be announced in February 2015.
11. All titles must be submitted by the publisher or the author(s). It is their responsibility to ensure that the books and copies of the respective English translation when applicable arrive in a timely and cost-free manner to the post addresses indicated by the prize manager.
12. Each submission must be sent to [prizemanager@conferenciasdoestoril.org](mailto:prizemanager@conferenciasdoestoril.org), with the following information:
  - a. book publication date
  - b. a general overview of its contents
  - c. a short CV of the author(s)
  - d. a photograph of the author (300dpi's quality)
  - e. the book design (Europe & International)
13. The **winning title will produce and carry a sticker that indicates it being awarded with The Estoril Global Issues Distinguished Book Prize.** The Organization will ask a proof of this.

14. **All editions of the awarded book must have the identification in the front of its cover as winner of The Estoril Global Issues Distinguished Book Prize.**
15. Receipts will be sent for accepted submissions. The publisher and authors will be notified should their book be shortlisted or chosen for the prize.
16. **The award will only be delivered** if the author(s) gives, at least, one public lecture at the Awards Ceremony at the Estoril Conferences; this is mandatory. If this is not possible, the prize will be awarded to the following book that the Jury selected.
17. **Jury**  

The evaluation of the books and deliberation of winner will be made by an international renowned jury composed by a *President or Jury Coordinator* and high level representatives of the following academic institutions:

  - **Georgetown University;**
  - **Hebrew University of Jerusalem;**
  - **Catholic University of Portugal;**
  - **Aarhus University;**
  - **Getulio Vargas Foundation;**
  - **University of Cape Town.**
18. The decisions of the Jury are not subject to appeal.
19. Eventual omissions in this Regulation shall be assessed by the Organization and its decision shall be final.
